- Will have reached 89,445 Wisconsin pre-school age children from 1998-2017.
- The total number of books being distributed through May 2018 will be 855,827.

Wisconsin Bookworms

Reading to young children helps them develop a love of reading, along with an enthusiasm for learning. Yet, children from families with limited incomes may not have the opportunity to own many books.

The Wisconsin Bookworms program is designed to provide free books to children who may not otherwise own books; giving them the experience of being read to and helping preschool children gain a lifelong love of reading. The families of the young children become involved in reading to their children and doing family literacy activities.

Partners

Working in partnership, University of Wisconsin Extension Family Living Programs, Wisconsin Public Television, and the Wisconsin Association for Home and Community Education (WAHCE), are bringing the Wisconsin Bookworms Program to 38 counties and over 5,000 children annually. This early literacy program and partnership has been operating since 1998.

In 2018, the Wisconsin Bookworms program will celebrate a 20-year milestone of serving young children in families around the state with limited resources.
